DEVELOPMENTS TODAY

ALBERTA

- Stage 1 of relaunch strategy proceeding with a regional approach
 - Calgary and Brookes have ³/₄ of Alberta's cases, and will have "slightly slower relaunch".
 All points below will be relaunched slower over a 2-week period.
 - On May 14:
 - Retail, hair styling, museums and art galleries, more surgeries, dental procedures, physiotherapy, chiropractic, optometry, and similar services will reopen.
 - Additionally, daycares, out of school care, and day camps (including summer school) with limits on occupancy.
 - Restaurants, cafes, pubs and bars with 50% of capacity seating
 - Post-secondary can resume flexible in-person and online learning
 - Places of worship may reopen with strict guidelines
 - Alberta's Chief Medical Officer of Health update from daily briefing
 - 70 Albertans in hospitals
 - 11 in intensive care
 - \circ 5,076 recovered cases, 1211 active confirmed cases
 - o 53 active cases, 400+ recovered in Edmonton
 - Outbreak declared at Horizon work camp (5 confirmed cases)

OTTAWA

- Canada Emergency Student Benefit application period launches May 15, 2020
 - Students that do not qualify for the CERB can apply.
 - o Backgrounder.
- Western Economic Diversification Canada launches Regional Relief and Recovery Fund to support local economy
 - Plan introduces measures to help with employee retention, rent payment, and capital access to pay bills.

OTHER PROVINCES/TERRITORIES

 Ontario is taking action to combat <u>a mysterious inflammatory illness</u> in children, potentially linked to COVID-19.



- Symptoms include fever, abdominal pain, gastrointestinal nausea, vomiting, diarrhea, rashes.
- The province is updating it's COVID-19 case definition to include these symptoms amongst children.

UPDATES

- In the United States, more than 83,000 people have died from COVID-19.
 - New model forecasts 147,000 deaths by August.
