A Message from the Regional Director of Emergency Management

From the onset of the pandemic, we have tried to ensure we are consistently providing our respective communities the most accurate and relevant COVID-19 information that is available to us. While this information can rapidly change as the pandemic evolves, we want to ensure you are able to access and find the information that you need. Much of the information that is shared by the Province or AHS, more times than not, we hear for the first time as you also.

Locally, we have seen an insurgence of COVID-19 cases over the last number of weeks. As of Sunday December 6th, we sat at 176 total cases, with <u>94</u> being active, and <u>82</u> recovered within the County of St. Paul, including the Towns of Elk Point and St. Paul. This can be found at:
